

## **POLICY ON CHANGES OF AUTHORSHIP, CORRECTIONS AND WITHDRAWAL OF PUBLISHED PAPERS**

ACTA GRAPHICA follows the Code of Conduct recommended by the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE).

### **Change of authorship**

All changes to the list of authors (addition, removal or reordering) must be agreed with all authors and submitted to the editorial board in writing. Requests for changes of authorship are considered before the paper is published online or in print. After publication, changes of authorship are usually not possible, except in exceptional cases when there is a clear error or omission. The editorial board will evaluate each request in accordance with the ethical guidelines and recommendations of COPE.

### **Corrections of data in published papers**

Authors are responsible for the accuracy of all data provided in the published paper. Before the issue is published, the corresponding author receives a digital proof of the paper to check the content and submit any corrections within three working days. After publication, if authors subsequently discover a significant error that may affect the understanding or accuracy of the published data, they are required to notify the editorial board. In such cases, a correction (erratum) is published, and readers are informed about this in the first following issue of the journal.

### **Withdrawal of a published paper**

If authors discover a serious omission after publication that affects the reliability of the results or the reproducibility of the research, they may request that the paper be withdrawn. In such cases, the online version of the paper will be marked with the note “withdrawn by the author”, while maintaining an active link to the original paper. If the editorial board, reviewers or readers determine that the paper (or part of it) has been previously published, that the data are inauthentic, or that the research was not conducted in accordance with ethical principles, the editorial board will consider the report and, if the violation is confirmed, withdraw the paper. Such papers will be marked with the note “withdrawn by the editorial board”, and the original link will remain active. All correction and retraction procedures are carried out in accordance with the guidelines of the Committee on Publishing Ethics (COPE):
